**About the 34<sup>th</sup> IOS Congress:** The aim of this Congress is to convene scientific members of the IOS, along with other scientists, academic members and students with interest on succulent plants, to share their research results, experience and questions, in order to contribute to the knowledge, conservation and rational use of this group of plants.

**The Congress themes are:** Scientific knowledge and praxis for conservation and integration of sustainable use of succulents. This includes taxonomy, ecology, conservation biology, ecological restoration, sustainable use, education.

**Guidelines:** 

**Language:** The official language of the Congress is English, which should be used in abstracts, presentations and printed materials. However, participations in Spanish or any of the IOS official languages will be welcome.

**Abstract submission:** All abstracts must be submitted as a Microsoft Word document, using Arial 12pt and including: (1) Title (20 words max.), (2) Presentation format (Oral/Poster), (3) Authors (Smith, P. G.) (Mark with \* the presenter's name); (4) Institution's name and address; (5) Author's email; (6) Abstract (300 words max.) including objectives, methods, results and conclusions; (6) Keywords (3-10).

Please send abstracts attached to an email entitled "IOS 2017 – Author's name" to the following email address: [anmaruri@concyteq.edu.mx](mailto:anmaruri@concyteq.edu.mx). A confirmation of receipt will be sent.

An *ad hoc* committee will review all abstracts. The committee reserves the right to decline any proposal.

**Oral presentations:** Only one oral presentation can be submitted per autor. Computer projection will be available for presentations at the meeting room. Please consider using PPT and PDF formats for slide shows.

**Poster presentations:** Posters should have a size of 150 x 100 cm (vertical presentation). IOS, Jardín Botánico Regional de Cadereyta and CONCYTEQ logotypes should be included. Accuracy and efficiency of communication should be the main criteria in designing posters. Mounting tape will be provided by the organizers.

## About Cadereyta de Montes and the venue



In central Mexico, the southern end of the Chihuahuan Desert is known as the “Semi Arid Zone of Queretaro and Hidalgo” (Semidesierto Queretano-Hidalgense, in Spanish). In the heart of this dry, tough, and rudely beautiful zone, lies the municipality of Cadereyta de Montes, in the State of Queretaro.

Located in the nearby of the steep slopes of the “Sierra del Doctor” and the Moctezuma river canyon, it has been the scenario of explorations of naturalists as Thomas Coulter, Carl August Ehrenberg, Joseph N. Rose and Fernando Altamirano, among others.

Cadereyta de Montes also conserves ancient traditions, folklore, mexican cuisine and arts and crafts. Several local families are skilled “charros”. The visitor can taste a traditional barbacoa with a mug of pulque, an ancient, pre-hispanic beverage made from several species of *Agave*. In the evening, a nice promenade is to walk from the Botanic Garden to the Plaza, and enjoy a cone of traditional ice cream while listening to the bells of the temples.

The closest airport is Queretaro “Fernando Espinosa Gutiérrez” International, (QRO) (40 km). The Mexico City “Benito Juárez” International Airport (MEX) is 210 km far.

**The venue:** The Jardín Botánico Regional de Cadereyta “Ing. Manuel González de Cosío” is an institution devoted to the conservation of the flora of this region; it keeps a living collection with more than 300 species of plants, and has developed, tested and published standard propagation protocols. Besides its stunning arrangements of cacti and other families, it keeps an interesting wild landscape inside its boundaries; has a small but active scientific research program and offers educational activities to visitors. **The weather:** Cadereyta has a mild, semi-arid climate. The average temperature of the year is between 12 and 19°C. Bring a light jacket or sweater, field shoes, a hat and UV-protection in your luggage.

**Accommodation:** Several hotels in the region (Cadereyta, Bernal and Tequisquiapan) are available. Lodging is not included in the registration fee and each participant should make individual arrangements. A list of hotels will be made available in subsequent announcements.
